1. To maintain high quality PE teaching and learning throughout the whole school.	Employ qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching aspects of PE as part of the school CPD programme	£12,842	Premier sport continues to maintain a high quality delivery of PE across the curriculum. Teachers requiring CPD within PE have the opportunity to work with the Premier Sport coach on topics which they feel less confident in teaching. Quality assurance of the provision has been completed jointly between Premier Sports and the head teacher. After discussion with the PE lead, it is felt that going forward we need to reduce the time allocated to coaches in the CPD model as staff subject knowledge for the teaching of PE is good.

2. To teach pupils the importance of resilience, empathy, self-awareness, positivity, excellence and communication through adventure based activities.	Introduction of Commando Joe school led programme with full day training for staff and full mission day with a Commando Joe for children.	£2,250	All staff have received training on Commando Joe resource. The children have all experienced a Commando Joe mission with a CJ leader and have additionally completed another mission in 'We are Family' week with their class teacher. This term the resource has been incorporated into the curriculum in each phase.
